<u>Targeted supports</u> for some students may include:

Serious Behaviour Breaches and Major Disciplinary Sanctions

A 'serious behaviour breach' at OLMC is understood generally as activities or behaviours of a student which:

x are offensive, or dangerous, to the physical or emotional health of any student or

staff

- x If a student is placed in a separate room as a means of seclusion, staff will maintain appropria te supervision of the student.
- x The least restrictive form of restraint/seclusion will be used for the minimum time possible.
- x The restraint/seclusion will cease as soon as the immediate danger for the student or others is averted.
- x Staff involved in an inc ident of restraint or seclusion will immediately notify the principal and provide for the immediate care and safety or those concerned.
- x The student's parents will be contacted. A post -incident evaluation and report will be completed .

Assessing and Mitiga ting Health and Safety Risks

To assist in the discharge of regulated health and safety responsibilities, the College will adhere to an Occupational Health & Safety Program through which potential safety hazards are identified and analysed in terms of the likelihood of an event occurring, and risk treatments are applied in order to prevent and/or manage the potential con sequences if the event was to occur.
